

**Field Experience Assessment:**  
Faculty advisors use standard assessment criteria and reporting forms provided by the FOE.

This assessment criteria is used formatively during the ongoing documentation of learning. For example:  
- Teacher candidate/intern (self-assessment)  
- instructors (formative assessment)  
- peers (peer assessment)

Candidate/intern is experiencing difficulty and/or is not meeting expectations for one or more criteria

Teacher candidate/intern, faculty advisor and mentor teacher meet in a timely manner and collaboratively determine a written action plan outlining goals,

Faculty advisor, mentor teacher and candidate/intern review action plan goals

Candidate/intern is still experiencing difficulty and/or is not meeting expectations for one or more criteria

In consultation with the Field Experience Coordinator, a Professional Assessment Report (PAR) is completed that outlines areas of concern, goals, supports, criteria for completion and a timeframe/review date.

Candidate/intern is satisfactorily meeting expectations on all criteria

Candidate/intern, faculty advisor, mentor teacher meet to review the PAR

If time permits

Candidate/intern has not met the goals outlined in the PAR

Candidate/intern has minimally met the goals outlined in the PAR

**Grading/Academic Performance Evaluations/Progression:**  
At the end of the field experience, referring to the standard assessment criteria, the faculty advisors review the documentation of learning from the field experiences and consults with the candidate/intern and the mentor teacher as required

Field Experience is terminated

Course Grade: Fail  
Not meeting expectations for one or more criteria

Course Grade: Pass  
Satisfactorily meeting expectations on all criteria

Fail: Candidate/intern will be discontinued or withdrawn from program

Student of Concern: at risk academically, Professional Assessment Report with action plan developed

In Good Standing: meeting expectations, progressing satisfactorily

Discontinued or Withdrawn from Program

'student of concern' for more than 2 courses or field experiences
